

2017 SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAMS

SUMMER LEARNING PROGRAMS FOR GRADES 7 & 8

Summer School Dates: Wednesday, July 5th – Thursday, July 27th, 2017

Continuing Education offers 4 different academic programs for grade 7 and 8 students that address specific student needs. To be able to register for the programs listed below, students in grades 7 and 8 must be recommended for one of the programs by their day school Principal.

1. ELL PROGRAM: Language Arts for English Language Learners for Grades 7 & 8

The Language Arts Program for English Language Learners (ELL) is a dynamic, interactive program focusing on the improvement of skills and language learning for students in ESL or ELD programs. In these programs, students will have a chance to practice and build oral, reading and writing skills while building confidence in their English. Students will improve their understanding and confidence in preparation for success at the next grade level. **This program is offered at D Roy Kennedy only.**

ELIGIBILITY: - Students in grade 7 or 8
- STEP 1 - 3 ESL or STEP 1 - 4 ELD

2. LA & Math Program: Language Arts and Math Program for Grades 7 & 8

The Grade 7 and 8 Language Arts and Math program is a dynamic, interactive program designed to boost students skills in Language Arts and Math based on current teaching approaches. Students can stay connected to learning and be ready for the next level of Language Arts and Math. Teachers will present materials and activities that will engage students in a positive environment. The emphasis is on productive group work and targeted skill development. Students will improve their understanding and confidence in preparation for success at the next grade level. **This program is offered at D Roy Kennedy and Sir Wilfrid Laurier SS.**

ELIGIBILITY: - Students in grade 7 or 8
- Students working at Level 1 or 2

3. Grade 9 MATH Prep Program (Get Ready for Grade 9 Math: Non-Credit for Grade 8 Students only)

The “Get Ready for Grade 9 Math” Preparation Program is designed to further develop the core knowledge, understanding of math concepts and skills needed for the grade 9 academic math program. This program builds on student’s prior knowledge and teachers will present materials and activities that will engage students in a positive environment. The emphasis is on productive group work and targeted skill development. Students will improve their understanding and confidence in preparation for success in grade 9 academic math. **This program is offered at Sir Woodroffe HS and Sir Wilfrid Laurier SS.**

ELIGIBILITY: - Students in grade 8
- Students working at Level 3 or higher who would benefit from additional preparation for grade 9 math

4. Reach Ahead Secondary Credit Program (Grade 8 Students only)

The Reach Ahead Secondary Credit Program provides an opportunity for students to supplement and enrich their secondary education by acquiring a credit in July. Students currently in grade 8 may choose to register for one of the following two below. **These courses are offered at Adult HS, John McCrae SS, Woodroffe SS, and Sir Wilfrid Laurier SS.**

- **CGC1D:** Geography of Canada (Academic) (*offered at all locations*)
- **FIF1D:** French Immersion (*offered only at John McCrae*)
- **MPM1D:** Principles of Mathematics (Academic) (*offered at all locations*)

ELIGIBILITY: - Students must be in grade 8
- It is recommended that students considering a reach-ahead course be performing consistently at a level 4

PM 12:20pm to 3:35pm (Language Arts Programs)**

SCHEDULE:

Regular attendance is mandatory. Students who miss more than two full classes may be withdrawn from the program. Please plan your vacations accordingly. **Wednesday, July 27th will be the final day of classes.** There are no classes on July 27, as teachers will be finalizing the last progress report and fulfilling other professional duties that day.

TRANSPORTATION:

Students attending grade 7 and 8 programs who live more than 3 kms from the summer school site will be eligible for OC Transpo service. OC Transpo Presto passes will only be available at the summer school sites on the FIRST day of classes.

Yellow school bus service: Pick-up and drop-off points will be offered as a courtesy service in rural areas. This service will be available to D Roy Kennedy, Woodroffe HS and Sir Wilfrid Laurier SS. This is a courtesy service only. The service may be shared by secondary school students attending summer school. Additional pick-up/drop-off points, door-to-door service, and midday service are not available. Routes will not be determined until the end of May. ***The yellow school bus schedule will be available by mid-June at www.summerschoolinottawa.com***

International Student Fees:

A \$250 per class (ex. AM or PM) fee payable by cash or post-dated cheque required for all international and out-of-province students.

Reach Ahead Secondary Credit Program Information

Dates: Wednesday, July 5th – Thursday, July 27th, 2017

Class Times: 8:30 am to 3:35 pm

To be eligible for a credit, students are required to attend the full session and complete a summative evaluation and write the final examination as scheduled. *Please plan your schedules accordingly.* Thursday, July 27 is designated as a conference day providing students with an opportunity to discuss marks and the final examination with the subject teacher. *****Information subject to change and courses will be offered subject to enrolment*****

TRANSPORTATION:

Note: Reach-ahead credit courses are part of the secondary school program.

Students attending a reach-ahead course are not eligible for a complimentary OC Transpo Presto Pass or the yellow school bus service. Dependent on enrollment in these programs, Continuing Education is sometimes able to allow students taking secondary credit courses to access the yellow school bus service. Information about Fees

Textbook Fees:

There is no Textbook Deposit Fee for students currently attending a day school. If a student fails to return the book or returns the book in poor condition, the student will be billed directly the full cost of the textbook.
